Movies as Literature

High School English credit for grades 9-12

Movies as Literature class will help high school students understand many classic novels as well as classic movies. The course will also help students evaluate movies as to their hidden agendas and deeper messages. Over the course of the year, we will watch 17 movies.



Students will write an essay on 15 of the movie while participating in class discussion, quizzes, hands on projects and a final test. We will also be studying vocabulary words each week. The movies cover a many different genres of movies (comedy, Western, Sci-Fi, classics, drama, musical and others). This class is a great way to introduce literature to those students who don't care for reading thick novels. The students will take weekly vocabulary quizzes to extend their vocabulary level.
